## Matt has been riding at Centaur Stride for 17 years

Matt has an extremely rare disorder, a DNA repair deficiency disease called Trichothiodystrophy. It affects his skin, hair, bones, blood, immune system, hearing, and cognition. Matt has been in a study for this disorder at the National Institute of Health in Bethesda, Maryland since August 2003. He is one of their oldest living patients with this rare diagnosis. There is no cure.

Matt started his adventure coming to Centaur Stride during a middle school field trip. That simple trip ignited a passion for riding, horses, and Centaur Stride that has only strengthened during the past 17 years

## "Their bond was indescribable"

Claire, Matt's mother, fondly recalls, "Matt's favorite memory is Dude! For a good 13 years everything revolved around Dude. Matt would talk about him like they were best buddies. One time when Matt was sick and unable to ride for a while, he asked me, 'Do you think Dude has missed me?' I told him, "Absolutely!!"

According to Claire, "Physically, he's enjoying himself and does not even realize how all of the tasks he loves to do are actually helping him. From the lifting of the tack all by himself to the brushing of the horses. From walking/leading the horse into and around the arena to the strengthening of his leg and core muscles. Riding has also helped his eye /hand, coordination, especially when he does the ring toss or throws the ball into the basketball hoop – all while on the horse. These are not easy tasks to do!"

He could easily do a figure-eight. He could ride through and around the cones. I was very impressed with how well he could ride. He made it all look easy.
